

# 2022-23 UCAS Timeline for Year 12s



### September - October 2022

- Make sure you understand the structure and demands of your school/college courses.
- Start exploring <u>university events and schemes</u>.
- Make notes to effectively identify key information about opportunities that will be most useful to you. Try <u>this activity</u> to get you thinking.



- Research the main post-18 pathways: <u>university</u>, <u>apprenticeships</u> and <u>employment</u>.
- Start applying for university open days, events and schemes, many of which are listed here.
- Keep a record of any experiences you have and subjectspecific skills you gain in <u>a table like this</u>.
- Refer to our <u>skills bank</u> for examples of academic skills most relevant to your chosen subject. You can then use these in your UCAS application.

### January – February 2023

- Make sure you understand the <u>UCAS process and timeline</u>.
- Ensure you are familiar with the structure of the UCAS form.



## March – April 2023

- Ensure you have a clear understanding of what university study involves and <a href="https://example.com/how-it-differs-from-school and college">how it differs from school and college</a>.
- Look into wider areas of university life as well, such as accommodation and extra-curricular opportunities.
- Make sure you know how student finance works.

## **May - June 2023**

- Research the <u>range of courses</u> available in your subject, including <u>joint/combined honours degrees</u> if applicable.
- Make your preliminary HE course choices. Give <u>this activity</u> a go to get you focused on some of the key factors.
- Ensure you are aware of any additional requirements for your chosen courses such as <u>interviews</u> and <u>admissions tests</u>.

## July - August 2023

- Review your HE course choices and their entry requirements.
- Start preparing for admissions tests if applicable to the courses you are applying for.
- Complete your initial personal statement draft over the summer holiday. You can find our key tips for writing an outstanding personal statement <a href="here">here</a>.
